BREAKING NEWS IN BREWERY SAFETY

Many craft breweries are experiencing a dramatic rise in workplace injuries during the coronavirus.

One report estimates this increase could be as much as 300% over pre-virus rates.

ROOT CAUSES OF INJURY AND ILLNESS DURING CORONOVIRUS

HUMAN FACTORS

State of Mind

- Expectancy vs. Reality
- Fear of Infection
- Frustration with People, Policies, Procedures
- Fatigue, Complacency
- Rushing, Distraction

Risky Behavior Stresses

- Hazard Normalization
- Policy Contradictions
 - Facemasks
 - Distancing
 - Hygiene
 - Sanitation

ECONOMIC FACTORS

Workforce Size

- Reduced due to cost
- Quarantined staff

Workforce Capability

- New job responsibilities
- Inadequate training
- Lack of SOPs
- Changing production & packaging schedules
